Materials:

2.5mm crochet hook.
Scheepjes Catona 281 Tangerine. (4 gr)
Scheepjes Catona 515 Emerald. (4 gr)
14mm safety eyes.
Scissors.
Fiber filling.
Yarn needle.

The horse is approx. 19cm high.

Brown horse:

Scheepjes Stone Washed 804 Boulder Opal. (50 gr) Scheepjes Stone Washed 802 Smokey Quartz. (6 gr) Scheepjes Stone Washed 819 New Jade. (2 gr) Scheepjes Catona 157 Root Beer. (10 gr) 10 round pencils.


White horse:

Scheepjes Stone Washed 801 Moon Stone. (58 gr) Scheepjes Catona 115 Hot Red. (2 gr)

Yarn information:

Do you use other yarn?
This can affect the size of the amigurumi.
Adjust the size of the safety eyes to your yarn.

Body (in Stone Washed 804/801)

Round 1: Magic circle 6 sc's (6)

Round 2: (inc) x6 (12)
Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)
Round 4: (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)
Round 5: (sc 3, inc) x6 (30)
Round 6: (sc 4, inc) x6 (36)
Round 7: (sc 5, inc) x6 (42)
Round 8: (sc 6, inc) x6 (48)

Round 9: sc all (48)

Round 10: (sc 7, inc) x6 (54)

Round 11-16: sc all (54)

Round 17: (sc 7, 2tog) x6 (48)

Round 18-20: sc all (48)

Round 21: (sc 6, 2tog) x6 (42)

Round 22-24: sc all (42)

Round 25: (sc 5, 2tog) x6 (36)

Round 26-27: sc all (36)

Round 28: (sc 4, 2tog) x6 (30)

Round 29: sc all (30)

Round 30: (sc 3, 2tog) x6 (24)

Round 31: sc all (24)

Round 32: (sc 2, 2tog) x6 (18)

Fasten off, leave a long tail, you will use this to sew the head on the body. Fill the body with fiber filling.

Mouth (in Stone Washed 804/801)

Round 1: Magic circle 6 sc's (6)

Round 2: (inc) x6 (12) Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)

Round 4-7: sc all (18)





Push round 7 flat. Crochet through 2 stitches at once to close the mouth. Do this with 9 sc's. Fasten off, weave in the tail.

Head (in Stone Washed 804/801)

Round 1: Magic circle 6 sc's (6)

Round 2: (inc) x6 (12) Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x6 (18) Round 4: (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)

Round 5: sc all (24)

Round 6: (sc 7, inc) x3 (27) Round 7: (sc 8, inc) x3 (30)

Round 8: sc all (30)

Round 9: (sc 9, inc) x3 (33) Round 10: (sc 10, inc) x3 (36)

Round 11: sc all (36)

Round 12: (sc 11, inc) x3 (39)

Round 13: sc all (39)

In the next round you will crochet the mouth to the head. Crochet through all the stitches of the head and mouth at once. First insert your needle in the stitch of the mouth, then through the stitch of the head.

Round 14: sc 2, crochet the mouth and head together with 9 sc's,

sc 28 (39)

Round 15: (sc 12, inc) x3 (42)

Round 16: sc all (42)

Round 17: (sc 13, inc) x3 (45)

Round 18: sc all (45)

Round 19: (sc 14, inc) x3 (48)

Round 20: sc all (48)

Round 21: (sc 15, inc) x3 (51)

Round 22: sc all (51)

Round 23: (sc 16, inc) x3 (54)

Round 24-25: sc all (54)

Place the 14mm eyes between round 20 and 21. Keep 11 stitches free between the eyes. Make sure the eyes and mouth are aligned.

Round 26: (sc 7, 2tog) x6 (48) Round 27: (sc 6, 2tog) x6 (42)

Round 28: sc all (42)

Round 29: (sc 5, 2tog) x6 (36) Round 30: (sc 4, 2tog) x6 (30)

Fill the head with fiber filling.

Round 31: (sc 3, 2tog) x6 (24) Round 32: (sc 2, 2tog) x6 (18) Round 33: (sc 1, 2tog) x6 (12)

Round 34: (2tog) x6 (6)

Fasten off, leave a long tail.

Weave the tail through the front loops of the last 6 stitches and pull tight. Weave in the tail.

Sew the head on top of the neck. The neck will be sewed between round 19 and 26 of the head. Stuff the

neck with more fiber filling once the hole between the neck and head is almost closed.



Arms (make 2x in Stone Washed 802 and 804/801)

Start with Stone Washed 802:

Round 1: Magic circle 6 sc's (6)

Round 2: (inc) x6 (12) Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)

Round 4: Back loop only: sc all (18)

Round 5: sc all (18)

Round 6: (sc 4, 2tog) x3 (15)

Change to Stone Washed 804/801 in the last single crochet of round 6.

Round 7-9: sc all (15)

Round 10: (sc 3, 2tog) x3 (12)

Round 11-17: sc all (12)

Fill the arm with fiberfilling.

Sc 2. Push round 17 flat. Crochet through 2 stitches at once to close the arm. Do this with 6 sc's.

Fasten off, leave a long tail.

Sew the arms between round 30 and 31 on the side of the body.



Legs (make 2x in Stone Washed 802 and 804/801)

Start with Stone Washed 802:

Round 1: Magic circle 6 sc's (6)

Round 2: (inc) x6 (12) Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x6 (18) Round 4: (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)

Round 5: Back loop only: sc all (24)

Round 6-7: sc all (24)

Round 8: (sc 6, 2tog) x3 (21)

Change to Stone Washed 804/801 in the last single crochet of round 6.

Round 9-11: sc all (21)

Round 12: (sc 5, 2tog) x3 (18)

Round 13-16: sc all (18)

Round 17: (sc 4, 2tog) x3 (15)

Round 18-20: sc all (15)

Fill the leg with fiber filling.

Round 21: (sc 3, 2tog) x3 (12)

Round 22: (2tog) x6 (6)

Fasten off, leave a long tail.

Weave the tail through the front loops of the last 6 stitches and pull tight.

Sew the legs between round 5 and 9 on the side of the body.



Ears (make 2x in Stone Washed 804/801)

Round 1: Magic circle 6 sc's (6) Round 2: (sc 1, inc) x3 (9)

Round 3: sc all (9)

Round 4: (sc 2, inc) x3 (12)

Round 5-7: sc all (12)

Push round 7 flat. Crochet through 2 stitches at once to close the ear. Do this with 6 sc's.

Sew the ears on top of the head between round 25 and 26. Keep 4 stitches free between the ears.

Belly button (in Stone Washed 804/801)

Cut a thread of approx. 60cm. Push the thread through the eye of the yarn needle. Embroider a cross on the body between round 11 and 14.

Keep 1 stitch free between the cross on the top, and 2 stitches on the bottom.





Picture 1. Push the needle on the right bottom inside the body, push it out on the left top (skip 1 round). Repeat this step 1x until it looks like picture 2.

Picture 2. Push the needle on the right bottom inside the body, push it out on the left bottom (skip 2 stitches).





Picture 3. Push the needle on the right top inside the body (skip 1 stitch from the left top), push it out on the left bottom. Push the needle on the right top inside the body, push it out on the right bottom (this step isn't in the pictures). Put a tight knot in the start and end thread and weave in the tails.

Manes and tail brown horse (in Catona 157)





Use 10 pencils, not 6 as on the picture.

Make a knot near the end of the pencil with the yarn.

Wrap the yarn tightly around the pencil as on the picture below. Make another knot on the end.



Repeat this for all 10 pencils.

Place the pencils in a bowl of water, and let them soak until the yarn is all wet.

Dry them on top of a heater. Another option is to put them in the oven for a little while. I placed them in an oven of 200 degrees Celsius for approx. 15 minutes, but the pencils didn't really like this since the outer shell cracked a bit.



As soon as the yarn has cooled down you can untie the knot on 1 side of the pencil and pull the yarn off.

Cut 30 threads of approx. 12cm. Cut 36 threads of approx. 25cm. Cut 14 threads of approx. 34 cm. You can measure this as the threads are curled.





For every hair you use 2 threads. Fold them in half to create a loop in the middle. Pull the loop through a stitch as shown above.





Push the ends of the threads through the loop and pull tight.

You will start with the shortest threads of 12cm.

The manes will first be placed between the ears, around round 25. Push the needle from the back forwards through a stitch.

Attach 6 hairs next to each other. In the round before this 5 hairs, in the round before this 3 hairs, in the round before this 1 hair.





Now you will start with the threads of 25cm.

Push the needle from the front backwards through a stitch. Make sure the hairs will go down in a straight line on the back of the head.


Attach 4 hairs next to each other behind the 6 shorter hairs between the ears. In the round after this 4 hairs, in the round after this 3 hairs, in the round after this 3 hairs, in the round after this 2 hairs, in the round after this 2 hairs.



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For the tail, attach 1 hair around round 6, 2 hairs around round 7 and 4 hairs around round 8.





Manes and tail white horse (in Stone Washed 801)

For the white manes you can use the yarn straight of the skein. Cut 30 threads of approx. 12cm. Cut 36 threads of approx. 25cm. Cut 14 threads of approx. 34 cm.

Attach them in the same way as the brown manes which are explained above.

Halster (in Stone Washed 819 or Catona 115)





Chain 40, connect the chain to a circle by making 1 sc in the 1st chain. Pay attention that the chain is not twisted.

Crochet 40 sc's (in every chain 1 single crochet, and in the connecting sc also a sc)

Chain 41, sc 1 in the 2nd ch from the hook, sc 39 (1 sc in every ch).

Fasten off with a sl st in the left stitch next to the start of the chain (see picture above).





Sew the end of the chain to the circle. Keep 23 stitches free between the start of the chain and the sewing of the chain. Weave in all the loose tails.

Carrots (in Catona 281 and 515)

Make as many carrots as you like. I made 4 carrots.

Catona 281:

Round 1: Magic circle 4 sc's (4)

Round 2: sc all (4)

Round 3: (sc 1, inc) x2 (6)

Round 4-5: sc all (6)

Round 6: (sc 1, inc) x3 (9)

Round 7-8: sc all (9)

Round 9: (sc 2, inc) x3 (12)

Round 10-14: sc all (12)

Fill the carrot with fiber filling.

Round 15: (2tog) x6 (6)

Fasten off, leave a long tail.

Weave the tail through the front loops of the last 6 stitches and pull tight.

Weave in the tail.

Now you will make the leaves with Catona 515.

Cut 3 threads of approx. 15cm.

Fold the 3 threads together to create a loop. Attach this on top of the carrot around round 15, in the same way as the manes.

Cut the threads at approx. 3cm and pull the yarn apart. Out of 1 thread you will get 4 thinner threads.
